

Freedom Bowl

Southern California's Anaheim Stadium is the site of one of the nation's most exciting and unpredictable bowl games. In its 10-year history, the Freedom Bowl has seen more than its share of upsets and unexpected endings.

The bowl, which is televised nationally by RAYCOM, has attracted such teams as Southern Cal, Washington, Florida, Brigham Young and Colorado. And this year the bowl will match teams from the powerful Pac-10 Conference and the wild Western Athletic Conference (WAC). 
