

From Otis Redding to the Temptations, from Aretha Franklin to the Four Tops, classic soul music shares one defining characteristic: great singing. All-4-One, then, should be considered four times blessed. Like few others working in contemporary music today, this versatile quartet fuses elements of R&B, doo-wop and jazz into a style of their own.

So Much In Love, All-4-One's debut single, soared into the top five on the pop charts within months of its release. In a testament to the song's genre-crossing appeal, its companion video became a hit on VH-1, MTV and The Box. Suddenly, Jamie Jones, Delious, Tony Borowiak and Alfred Nevarez—the four Southern Californians who make up All-4-One— were poised on the brink of stardom. Their Grammy-winning single *I Swear* became one of the top hits of 1994.

Although All-4-One's moniker has been interpreted by some as a comment on the group's multi-ethnic background, they never set out to be a rainbow coalition. "This 'United Nations' look wasn't planned," insists Jones. "We were just looking to put together the best vocal mix."

For All-4-One, the bottom line is singing— and great songs. Few other groups in contemporary music could huddle around one microphone in a recording studio and produce such entrancing, enduring music.



Travis Tritt

Ten Feet Tall and Bulletproof is more than the title of one of the hottest CDs out today; it also aptly describes one of the biggest names in country rock, Travis Tritt.

Performing in front of a TV audience of one billion fans at the 1994 Super Bowl kicked off a year that just kept getting better and better for Tritt. Next on the agenda was sharing the big screen with Keifer Sutherland and Woody Harrelson in *The Cowboy Way* and having a permanent slot as the host of the *VH-1 Country Countdown* series.

Easily one of the most visible stars in the industry, Tritt is leaving his mark everywhere. Singled out by *People* magazine for his hard-rocking, smoking duet with David Lee Roth, Tritt was also the only country artist to join Madonna, the Red Hot Chili Peppers and Tom Petty on a tribute album to George Harrison.

Since he first burst on the scene with *Country Club*, Tritt has sold over six million albums, performed in concert for millions of fans and, in 1992, was inducted into the Grand Ole Opry as its youngest member ever.




Holidays at Home will feature additional high-profile entertainers from a variety of musical backgrounds.



Holidays at Home will be produced by Emmy Award-winning producer Cary Glotzer and his newly-formed company Tupelo-Honey Productions. Glotzer, a 1984 graduate of New York University, has produced several network, cable and syndication projects over the last few years and has served as executive producer for a wide variety of programs ranging from Elvis Presley documentaries and entertainment specials to Sports Illustrated's 1995 swimsuit special.

Glotzer got his start in television working with Bryant Gumbel for NBC in 1980. In 1988, at age 26, he became a producer for NBC Sports for Bob Costas, Dick Enberg and Ahmad Rashad. He won two national Emmy Awards as executive producer for the nationally syndicated program Insport that featured Hollywood stars and sports celebrities.
