

LIFETIME LPGA TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS

PRESENTED BY SOUTHERN LIVING

Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail, Auburn/Opelika, Alabama October 8-11, 1998

Raycom Sports, the sports management company of the Longs Drugs Challenge, has brought together Lifetime Television, *Southern Living* and the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail to present another LPGA event, the Tournament of Champions, October 8-11, 1998, in Auburn/Opelika, Alabama. The event, in its first year in Alabama and its fifth year overall, will be the first LPGA event ever televised by Lifetime Television, which reaches nearly 70 million homes. The tournament will also benefit breast cancer awareness and research.

"By bringing the LPGA together with Lifetime Television and Southern Living, we are exposing a whole new audience to women's professional golf," said Raycom Sports Vice President of Golf Operations Brian Flajole. "This exposure only adds to the growth opportunity of an already popular women's sport. Just look at last year's incredible four-day attendance of 57,500 at the Longs Drugs Challenge. People love the LPGA!"

The field for the Tournament of Champions, with a total purse of \$750,000, is limited to winners from 1996, 1997 and 1998 Tour events, as well as active LPGA Hall of Fame members. Previous winners of the tournament include 1995 and 1997 LPGA Player of the Year Annika Sorenstam, Dottie Pepper, Liselotte Neumann and Dawn Coe-Jones.

"The Tournament of Champions is one of the premier events on the LPGA schedule," said Jim Ritts, commissioner of the LPGA, "and we believe Lifetime, *Southern Living* and Raycom Sports are the perfect partners to showcase the tournament. I think Lifetime's viewers and *Southern Living*'s readers will be intrigued and captivated by the compelling stories and drama that come from a tournament which includes the best-known names in women's golf and women's sports."

Lifetime's five hours of coverage includes live telecasts on Saturday, October 10, from 2:00 to 4:00 p.m. EST, and Sunday, October 11, from 4:00 to 6:00 p.m. EST. The network will also air late-night highlights on Thursday and Friday, October 8 and 9, from 11:30 to 12:00 midnight EST. The tournament complements Lifetime's annual breast cancer awareness efforts and will include a fund-raising component for breast cancer research.

The tournament will be played a Grand National in Auburn/Opelika, Alabama, part of the world-renowned Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. The Trail consists of 324 holes at seven public courses throughout the state of Alabama. Grand National was host to the 1997 Nike Tour Championship and will host the 2000 NCAA Men's Division I National Championship.
